‘While You Were Out’ Star Evan Farmer Completes Two Weeks to Taxi Sportsman!

Arlington, WA, November 3, 2008—Evan Farmer may look like the ‘boy next door,’ but he surely isn’t. His list of life accomplishments includes starring in MTV’s *2GE+HER* as well as The Learning Channel’s hit series *While Your Were Out*. Farmer has also set paragliding records, run marathons, climbed Mount Rainier, dived on shipwrecks, and much more. Now he says he’s added one of his life’s most fulfilling accomplishments to his resume—he built his own high-performance Sportsman 2+2 as part of Glasair’s Two Weeks to Taxi program.

Farmer documented the entire process on video and recently posted it on YouTube (<http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=JmPZbfYWNT0>).

“When I was ready to buy a plane, I looked and test flew everything, from the Mooney, the Cirrus, the Husky, Super Cub. I mean I wanted an airplane that could literally do everything and I ultimately found that in the Sportsman,” he says. “This is an airplane that’s way ahead of its time.”

With its slow speed handling characteristics, the Glasair Sportsman 2+2 enjoys a reputation as a world class back country aircraft. Cruise speeds in excess of 160mph also make it a formidable cross country plane. Glasair’s Two Weeks to Taxi program allows pilots with little or no building experience to put together a Sportsman 2+2 with assistance from factory personnel in as little as two weeks. The program complies with the FAA’s rules and regulations regarding owner-built aircraft.

Farmer completed his Glasair Sportsman right on schedule. His reaction to getting to fly the airplane he built for the first time? “It was SSSWWEEEEEEEEET!!!” he said.

After passing an FAA inspection and local test flights, Farmer flew his new Sportsman 2+2 from the Glasair factory in Arlington, Washington all the way across the country to New York. “This is something you can’t experience any other way,” Farmer says. On the way home he remembers thinking “I built this plane and I’m now over the Grand Canyon!”

“The Two Weeks to Taxi program is not just an investment in a fantastic plane, but it’s an investment in the knowledge about how that plane works and operates. You can’t put a price on confidence and safety.”

Glasair’s Two Weeks to Taxi program recently celebrated its 100th customer-built aircraft.
